An audit was carried out under the supervision of an external expert, Dr. Janak Makwana, a retired principal from D.G. Shikshan Mahavidyalaya. Dr. Makwana brought a wealth of experience and expertise to the audit process, ensuring a thorough and impartial evaluation of the institution's practices. His tenure as a retired principal adds significant value to the audit, as he brings a comprehensive understanding of educational institutions and their operational dynamics. The inclusion of Dr. Makwana in the supervision of the audit reflects our commitment to transparency, objectivity, and the pursuit of excellence in institutional practices.

Criteria 1: Curricular Aspects



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
cultural elements. The Gandhi Quiz on October 2nd reflected the institution's dedication to intellectual pursuits and awareness of historical figures.


IQAC noted the events
